


The Frayer Model is a graphic organizer used for building students' vocabulary. This strategy prompts students to define or read a student-friendly description of a target vocabulary word or concept and then apply their knowledge by generating examples and non-examples, giving characteristics, and sometimes drawing a picture to illustrate the meaning of the word. At P.S. 170, we use the Frayer Model in various content areas and have customized it for a variety of needs.

Student Impact:

- Vocabulary Development
- Assists in identifying and defining unfamiliar concepts
- Helps students gain the language to describe essential characteristics
- Provides examples that help clarify and deepen understanding of a concept or a word




