

Myths About Teaching

- Teachers Must Retain All the Power
 In the 21st century, students are leaders and facilitators, not just consumers of information.
- 2 Classroom Rules Ensure Good Behavior
 Simply having rules does not prevent students from breaking them
 nor does it teach them self-management or control.
- 3 Students Should Be Intrinsically Motivated Remember: students are motivated (or have a lack of motivation) to learn for a variety of reasons.
- Conditional Praise Is Necessary and Effective
 Giving students compliments or rewarding them because they have
 done something you like or appreciate can be manipulative.
- 5 Warnings Work
 A classroom management plan is only as effective as our willingness to follow through on the conditions we use to create it.
- Administrators and Parents Should Be the Disciplinarians
